

With planning granted for 450 new homes on the south side of the railway line in Longniddry, a consultation held by the developers has identified key areas of residents' concern. The Council's Road Department are currently working on plans and Lachlan is committed to ensuring that they are delivered as soon as possible.

We need to address residents' worries about the increase in traffic through the village - and that we have any new infrastructure in place as soon as possible."
